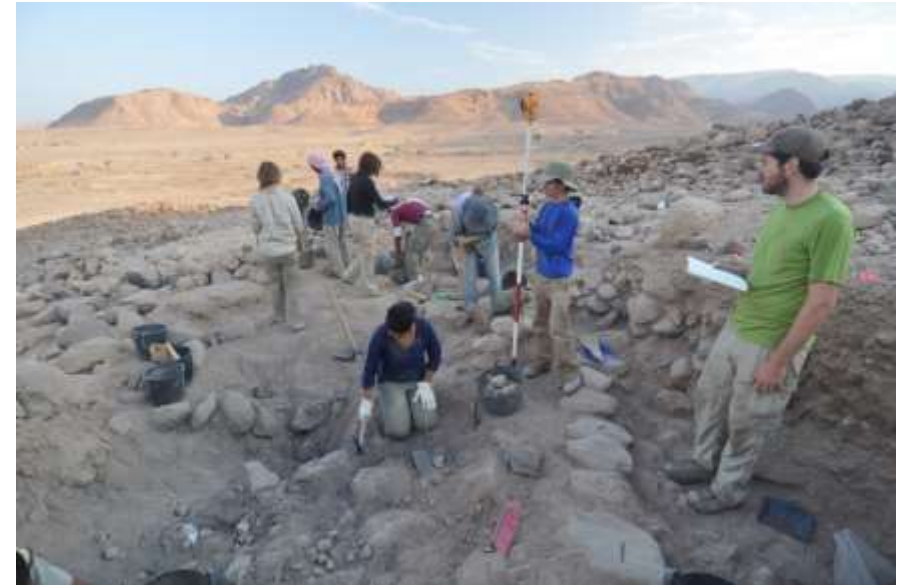


Jordan Archaeological Expedition 2014
